Yesterday, at the request of Mr. Arrington, Dr. Palms arranged a meeting with Dawn Ward which was attended by three BSA students, Mr. Arrington, and myself.

Since funds are not available to staff the Afro-America Reading Room, it was agreed that the Candler Librarian should lock the room and that persons needing to consult or borrow books and journals kept there should be able to do so by borrowing a key from the Loan Desk upstairs.

Mr. Arrington reported that a program of Black Studies had been formulated and that recommendations would soon be forthcoming. Mr. Lyle pointed out that the recommendation for these courses should include the necessary costs for library staff and books.

No one, to my knowledge, kept minutes of the meeting, but if I have reported anything incorrectly, I am sure that Dr. Palms or some other person in attendance will send you a note.
